



CROCHET PATTERN



Beaded Jewels Cowl

DIFFICULTY



UK TERMS

A beautiful, quick and easy cowl! And it's also perfect for beginners too!



MATERIALS

YARN

Yarn – Any DK weight yarn 100g. I used 10 different shades but you can use whatever colours you like. I used approx. 15g each of the below shades of King Cole Forest Aran Yarn

- Gisburn Forest
- Kielder Forest
- Epping Forest
- Forest of Dean
- Sherwood Forest
- Grizedale Forest
- Avondale Forest
- Balvain Woods
- Wyre Forest
- Hartwood Forest

HOOK

4mm

STITCH ABBREVIATIONS

UK Terms

- CH - Chain
- DC - Double Crochet
- TR - Treble Crochet
- STS - Number of stitches at the end of the round

OTHER ITEMS

- Yarn needle
- Scissors

FINISHED SIZE

Size - approximately 32cm x 21.5cm

NOTES

- Ch1 at the beginning of each round DOES NOT count as a stitch.
- Pattern is worked in the round.
- Be careful not to twist your chain when you join it.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Bead Stitch - *yarn over, insert the hook behind the tr you have just made from front to back, yarn over and pull through a loop* do this 4 times around the same tr (9 loops on the hook) Yarn over and pull through 8 loops, yarn over and pull through remaining loops on the hook.

PATTERN

To Start – 4mm hook, in Gisburn Forest chain 115, join with a ss to the first chain to form a ring, be careful not to twist your chain as you will be working into the chain stitches.

Round 1

Into the chain stitches dc in each stitch around, ss to first dc [115 sts]

Round 2

Ch1, tr, *tr, bead stitch around tr, skip 1 stitch, tr** repeat from * to ** to the end, ss to the top of the first tr [115 sts, 38 bead stitches]

Round 3

Ch1, dc in each stitch around, ss to first dc [115 sts]

Round 4 Join Kielder Forest

Ch1, dc in each stitch around, ss to first dc [115 sts]

Round 5

Ch1, tr, *tr, bead stitch around tr, skip 1 stitch, tr** repeat from * to ** to the end, ss to the top of the first tr [115 sts, 38 bead stitches].

Round 6

Ch1, dc in each stitch around, ss to first dc [115 sts]

Repeat rounds 4 – 6 with the rest of your colours or until you have 30 rounds.

To Finish - Break yarn, sew all ends in.
