



CROCHET PATTERN



Chevron Moss Stitch Advent Scarf

DIFFICULTY



UK TERMS

This year I got a hand dyed yarn advent calendar which has x24 mini skeins of beautiful hand dyed yarn and I decided to make a scarf that includes all 24 mini 10g skeins! Taking inspo from @daisiesdelight beautiful chevron blanket and the chevron moss stitch scarf idea was born!



MATERIALS

YARN

Yarn - Any DK weight yarn 240g

I used x24 mini 10g skeins of hand dyed yarn from my 2024 advent calendar from @sewhappycreativ

Any mini skeins would work in dk weight.

HOOK

5mm

OTHER ITEMS

Yarn needle
Scissors

GAUGE

20 sts x 15 rows = 10cm x 10cm

STITCH ABBREVIATIONS

UK Terms

Ch - Chain
DC - Double Crochet
() - Repeat in same stitch
[] Repeat as many times stated
STS - Number of stitches at the end of the round

FINISHED SIZE

Size - approximately 148cm x 18cm

NOTES

- The pattern works in rows.
- Chain 1 at the beginning of the row, does not count as a stitch.
- Turn at the end of each row.
- Stitch count is for this pattern, if you make yours wider, your stitch count will be different.

The pattern is easy to adjust you just need to start with a chain with a multiple of 14 for the width of your scarf. Then follow the pattern until you have the length you are happy with.

PATTERN

To Start – Chain 56 working in the 4th chain from the hook (counts as dc and chain 1).

Row 1: Dc, ch1, skip 1 chain, dc in next ch, ch1, skip 1, (dc, ch1, dc) in next chain, [ch1, skip 1, dc in next chain] x3, * skip 1, [dc in next chain, ch1, skip 1] x3, (dc, ch1, dc) in next chain, [ch1, skip 1, dc in next chain] x3; repeat from * across to the end, turn. (32 sts, 29 ch1 spaces)

Row 2: Ch1, skip 1, [dc in ch1 space, ch1, skip 1] x3, (dc, ch1, dc) in next ch1 space, [ch1, skip 1, dc in ch1 space] x3, * skip 2 dc, [dc in ch1 space, ch1, skip 1] x3, (dc, ch1, dc) in next ch1 space, [ch1, skip 1, dc in ch1 space] x3; repeat from * across to the end, with last dc worked into the ch4 space, turn. (32 sts, 29 ch1 spaces)

Row 3: Ch1, skip 1, [dc in ch1 space, ch1, skip 1] x3, (dc, ch1, dc) in next ch1 space, [ch1, skip 1, dc in ch1 space] x3, * skip 2 dc, [dc in ch1 space, ch1, skip 1] x3, (dc, ch1, dc) in next ch1 space, [ch1, skip 1, dc in ch1 space] x3, repeat from * across to the last stitch, skip last dc, turn. (32 sts, 29 ch1 spaces)

Note - Make sure you join your new yarn as and when you want to. I just used the full mini skein and changed where ever my yarn ran out.

Row 4 onwards: Repeat Row 3 until you have your desired length.

Break yarn and sew all your ends in.

2 options to finish

Option 1: Leave as it is and use as a lovely scarf to wrap around.

Option 2: You can leave a little bit of yarn at the end and join your ends together to turn your scarf into an infinity scarf!
