



CROCHET PATTERN

Fluffy Bunny Tail Wall Hanging In 2 sizes

DIFFICULTY



UK TERMS



This super cute wall hanging is such a lovely make and perfect for beginners! You get 2 patterns for 2 different sizes!



MATERIALS

YARN

Yarn – 50g of any DK weight yarn for the main and 20g of either DK or Fluffy yarn for the Rabbit section.

I used the below:

- Yarn A – Main Colour - Stylecraft Special DK, Candyfloss or Wisteria
- Yarn B – Bunny Colour - Peter Pan Precious Chunky – Duckling
- Yarn C – Tassels & Pom Pom - Stylecraft Special DK – Cream

HOOK

4.5mm

GAUGE

19 sts x 19 rows = 10cm x 10cm

STITCH ABBREVIATIONS

UK Terms

CH - Chain
DC – Double Crochet
STS – Number of stitches at the end of the row

FINISHED SIZE

Big Bunny – 23cm x 17cm
Small Bunny – 17cm x 13cm
Excluding tassels

OTHER ITEMS

Wooden Dowl – Big Bunny 20cm, Mini Bunny 15cm
Pom Pom Maker
Scissors
Yarn Needle

NOTES

- Ch1 at the beginning of each round DOES NOT count as a stitch.
- You will need to weigh a small amount of Yarn B (10g) out for the ears
- Pattern is worked in rows.
- Both Charts are at the end of the pattern.

Tapestry Crochet

This Fluffy Bunny wall hanging is made using tapestry crochet. For this wall hanging you are going to use two colours, and you will carry the additional yarn along with you and work over it as you crochet the row. You only need to carry the yarn you use for the “background”, not the one you use for the bunny. Working with the fluffy yarn can be tricky as it is hard to see the stitches. You can feel out the stitches with your finger and always count them while you crochet. I would recommend to mark each row on the chart as you finish.

Reading the Chart & Changing Colours

The chart, each square represents one stitch. Follow the chart by crocheting one stitch for one square. You need to change your colours according to the colour changes on the chart. Odd rows are worked from right to left, even rows are worked from left to right.

Changing colours happens in the middle of the stitch. When you have two loops of Yarn A on your hook, yarn over with Yarn B, and pull through all of the loops on the hook to finish the stitch. Don't forget to carry the background yarn along while you crocheting the bunny. When you're finished with the alpaca part in each row, just drop the fluffy yarn as you don't have to carry it along.



PATTERN

BIG BUNNY

To Start - 4.5mm hook, in Yarn A chain 33

Row 1 - In the 2nd chain from the hook dc in each stitch to the end, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 2 - (Yarn A) 13dc, (Yarn B) 6dc, (Yarn A) 13dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 3 - (Yarn A) 12dc, (Yarn B) 8dc, (Yarn A) 12dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 4 - (Yarn A) 11dc, (Yarn B) 10dc, (Yarn A) 11dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 5 - (Yarn A) 10dc, (Yarn B) 12dc, (Yarn A) 10dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 6 - (Yarn A) 9dc, (Yarn B) 14dc, (Yarn A) 9dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Rows 7 - 13 - (Yarn A) 8dc, (Yarn B) 16dc, (Yarn A) 8dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 14 - (Yarn A) 9dc, (Yarn B) 14dc, (Yarn A) 9dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 15 - (Yarn A) 10dc, (Yarn B) 12dc, (Yarn A) 10dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 16 - (Yarn A) 11dc, (Yarn B) 10dc, (Yarn A) 11dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 17 - (Yarn A) 12dc, (Yarn B) 8dc, (Yarn A) 12dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Rows 18 - 20 - (Yarn A) 13dc, (Yarn B) 6dc, (Yarn A) 13dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 21 - (Yarn A) 12dc, (Yarn B) 8dc, (Yarn A) 12dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Rows 22 - 23 - (Yarn A) 11dc, (Yarn B) 10dc, (Yarn A) 11dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Rows 24 - 26 - (Yarn A) 10dc, (Yarn B) 12dc, (Yarn A) 10dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Rows 27 - 28 - (Yarn A) 11dc, (Yarn B) 10dc, (Yarn A) 11dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Rows 29 - 30 - (Yarn A) 12dc, (Yarn B) 8dc, (Yarn A) 12dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 31 - (Yarn A) 11dc, (Yarn B) 10dc, (Yarn A) 11dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Note - You will now need to join in your 2nd small ball of Yarn B for one of the ears.

Rows 32 - 33 - (Yarn A) 10dc, (Yarn B) 5dc, (Yarn A) 2dc, (Yarn B) 5dc, (Yarn A) 10dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Rows 34 - 35 - (Yarn A) 9dc, (Yarn B) 5dc, (Yarn A) 4dc, (Yarn B) 5dc, (Yarn A) 9dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 36 - (Yarn A) 8dc, (Yarn B) 5dc, (Yarn A) 6dc, (Yarn B) 5dc, (Yarn A) 8dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 37 - (Yarn A) 8dc, (Yarn B) 4dc, (Yarn A) 8dc, (Yarn B) 4dc, (Yarn A) 8dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 38 - (Yarn A) 8dc, (Yarn B) 3dc, (Yarn A) 10dc, (Yarn B) 3dc, (Yarn A) 8dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Row 39 - (Yarn A) 8dc, (Yarn B) 2dc, (Yarn A) 12dc, (Yarn B) 2dc, (Yarn A) 8dc, turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Rows 40 - 44 - (Yarn A) 32dc turn, ch1 [32 sts]

Don't tie off. Go to Border section.

SMALL BUNNY

To Start - 4.5mm hook, in Yarn A chain 25

Row 1 - In the 2nd chain from the hook dc in each stitch to the end, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Row 2 - (Yarn A) 10dc, (Yarn B) 4dc, (Yarn A) 10dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Row 3 - (Yarn A) 9dc, (Yarn B) 6dc, (Yarn A) 9dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Row 4 - (Yarn A) 8dc, (Yarn B) 8dc, (Yarn A) 8dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Row 5 - (Yarn A) 7dc, (Yarn B) 10dc, (Yarn A) 7dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Rows 6 - 9 - (Yarn A) 6dc, (Yarn B) 12dc, (Yarn A) 6dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Row 10 - (Yarn A) 7dc, (Yarn B) 10dc, (Yarn A) 7dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Row 11 - (Yarn A) 8dc, (Yarn B) 8dc, (Yarn A) 8dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Row 12 - (Yarn A) 9dc, (Yarn B) 6dc, (Yarn A) 9dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Rows 13 -14 - (Yarn A) 10dc, (Yarn B) 4dc, (Yarn A) 10dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Row 15 - (Yarn A) 9dc, (Yarn B) 6dc, (Yarn A) 9dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Rows 16 - 17 - (Yarn A) 8dc, (Yarn B) 8dc, (Yarn A) 8dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Rows 18 - 19 - (Yarn A) 7dc, (Yarn B) 10dc, (Yarn A) 7dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Rows 20 - 21 - (Yarn A) 8dc, (Yarn B) 8dc, (Yarn A) 8dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Row 22 - (Yarn A) 9dc, (Yarn B) 6dc, (Yarn A) 9dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Note - You will now need to join in your 2nd small ball of Yarn B for one of the ears.

Row 23 - (Yarn A) 9dc, (Yarn B) 2dc, (Yarn A) 2dc, (Yarn B) 2dc, (Yarn A) 9dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Row 24 - (Yarn A) 8dc, (Yarn B) 3dc, (Yarn A) 2dc, (Yarn B) 3dc, (Yarn A) 8dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Row 25 - (Yarn A) 8dc, (Yarn B) 2dc, (Yarn A) 4dc, (Yarn B) 2dc, (Yarn A) 8dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Row 26 - (Yarn A) 7dc, (Yarn B) 3dc, (Yarn A) 4dc, (Yarn B) 3dc, (Yarn A) 7dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Rows 27 - 28 - (Yarn A) 7dc, (Yarn B) 2dc, (Yarn A) 6dc, (Yarn B) 2dc, (Yarn A) 7dc, turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Rows 29 - 32 - (Yarn A) 24dc turn, ch1 [24 sts]

Don't tie off.





Continued.....

Border

Yarn A will be still attached, turn and dc back along the top, 3dc in the first corner. 1dc in each row along the edge of your wall hanging to the corner, 3dc in the corner, 1dc along the bottom of your wall hanging, 3dc in the corner, 1dc in each row, 2dc in the last corner where you did your first dc, ss to the first dc made. Break yarn and sew all ends in.

If your corners are curling you might want to block it before adding to dowel.

Pom pom & Tassels

I used 2 colours for my pom pom tail, Yarn A & C. I just held the ends together and made a small pom pom. I attached the pom pom near the bottom of the bunny. I made x2 tassels also using 2 colours, Yarn A & C.

Attaching to dowel

Now you need to attach your wall hanging to your dowel. I like to crochet mine onto the dowel as I feel it is nice and secure. Here is a YouTube video on attaching your yarn to your dowel

You could also just sew your piece on to the dowel using a needle and long thread of yarn going through every stitch along the top and round your dowel.


To finish sew all ends in.




Big Bunny Chart
