# Fluffy Sheep Wall Hanging



This super cute wall hanging is such a lovely make and perfect for beginners!



## MATERIALS

### YARN

Yarn –  
 50g of any DK yarn – Blue  
 20g of any DK yarn – Green  
 10g of any DK yarn - Yellow  
 20g of either DK or Fluffy yarn – Cream & Grey

I used the below:

- Yarn A – Grass Colour - Stylecraft Special DK, Meadow
- Yarn B – Sky Colour - Stylecraft Special DK, Cloud Blue
- Yarn C – Grey Fluffy – Sirdar Alpine, Seal
- Yarn D – Cream Fluffy - Peter Pan Precious Chunky, Duckling
- Yarn E - Stylecraft Special DK, Dandelion

### HOOK

4.5mm

### STITCH ABBREVIATIONS

#### UK Terms

MR - Magic Ring  
 CH - Chain  
 DC – Double Crochet  
 STS – Number of stitches at the end of the row

#### FINISHED SIZE

Approximately – 16.5cm x 21cm  
 Excluding tassels

#### OTHER ITEMS

Wooden Dowel – 25cm  
 Scissors  
 Yarn Needle

#### GAUGE

19 sts x 19 rows = 10cm x 10cm

### NOTES

- Ch1 at the beginning of each round DOES NOT count as a stitch.
- Pattern is worked in rows.
- Chart is at the end of the pattern.

#### Tapestry Crochet

This Fluffy Sheep wall hanging is made using tapestry crochet. For this wall hanging you are going to use different colours, and you will carry the additional yarn along with you and work over it as you crochet the row. You only need to carry the yarn you use for the “background”, not the one you use for the sheep. Working with the fluffy yarn can be tricky as it is hard to see the stitches. You can feel out the stitches with your finger and always count them while you crochet. I would recommend to mark each row on the chart as you finish.

#### Reading the Chart & Changing Colours

The chart, each square represents one stitch. Follow the chart by crocheting one stitch for one square. You need to change your colours according to the colour changes on the chart. Odd rows are worked from right to left, even rows are worked from left to right.

Changing colours happens in the middle of the stitch. When you have two loops of Yarn A on your hook, yarn over with Yarn B, and pull through all of the loops on the hook to finish the stitch. Don't forget to carry the background yarn along while you crocheting the Sheep. When you're finished with the sheep part in each row, just drop the fluffy yarn as you don't have to carry it along.



# PATTERN

**To Start – 4.5mm hook, in Yarn A chain 42**

**Row 1** - In the 2nd chain from the hook dc in each stitch to the end, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 2** - (Yarn A) 16dc, (Yarn C) 2dc, (Yarn A) 5dc, (Yarn C) 2dc, (Yarn A) 16dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 3** - (Yarn A) 16dc, (Yarn C) 2dc, (Yarn A) 5dc, (Yarn C) 2dc, (Yarn A) 16dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 4 – Drop Yarn A and join Yarn B** - (Yarn B) 16dc, (Yarn C) 2dc, (Yarn B) 5dc, (Yarn C) 2dc, (Yarn B) 16dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 5 – Drop Yarn C and join Yarn D** - (Yarn B) 16dc, (Yarn D) 9dc, (Yarn B) 16dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 6** - (Yarn B) 15dc, (Yarn D) 11dc, (Yarn B) 15dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 7** - (Yarn B) 14dc, (Yarn D) 13dc, (Yarn B) 14dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 8** - (Yarn B) 13dc, (Yarn D) 15dc, (Yarn B) 13dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 9** - (Yarn B) 12dc, (Yarn D) 17dc, (Yarn B) 12dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 10** - (Yarn B) 11dc, (Yarn D) 19dc, (Yarn B) 11dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 11 – Join Yarn C** - (Yarn B) 10dc, (Yarn D) 9dc, (Yarn C) 3dc, (Yarn D) 9dc, (Yarn B) 10dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 12** - (Yarn B) 9dc, (Yarn D) 9dc, (Yarn C) 5dc, (Yarn D) 9dc, (Yarn B) 9dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Rows 13 - 19** - (Yarn B) 8dc, (Yarn D) 9dc, (Yarn C) 7dc, (Yarn D) 9dc, (Yarn B) 8dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 20** - (Yarn B) 8dc, (Yarn D) 8dc, (Yarn C) 9dc, (Yarn D) 8dc, (Yarn B) 8dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 21** - (Yarn B) 8dc, (Yarn D) 7dc, (Yarn C) 3dc, (Yarn D) 5dc, (Yarn C) 3dc, (Yarn D) 7dc, (Yarn B) 8dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 22** - (Yarn B) 9dc, (Yarn D) 6dc, (Yarn C) 2dc, (Yarn D) 7dc, (Yarn C) 2dc, (Yarn D) 6dc, (Yarn B) 9dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 23 – Drop Yarn C** - (Yarn B) 10dc, (Yarn D) 21dc, (Yarn B) 10dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 24** - (Yarn B) 10dc, (Yarn D) 21dc, (Yarn B) 10dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 25** - (Yarn B) 12dc, (Yarn D) 17dc, (Yarn B) 12dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Rows 26 - 27** - (Yarn B) 13dc, (Yarn D) 15dc, (Yarn B) 13dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 28** - (Yarn B) 15dc, (Yarn D) 11dc, (Yarn B) 15dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Row 29** - (Yarn B) 16dc, (Yarn D) 9dc, (Yarn B) 16dc, turn, ch1 [41 sts]

**Rows 30 - 34** - (Yarn B) 41dc turn, ch1 [41 sts]

Don't tie off.





**Continued.....**

### **Border**

Yarn B will be still attached, turn and dc back along the top, 3dc in the first corner. 1dc in each row along the edge of your wall hanging to the grass then change to Yarn A and dc to the corner, 3dc in the corner, 1dc along the bottom of your wall hanging, 3dc in the corner, 1dc in each row then change to Yarn B and dc to the last corner and 2dc in the last corner where you did your first dc, ss to the first dc made.

Break yarn and sew all ends in.

If your corners are curling you might want to block it before adding to dowel.

### **Tassel Fringe - Optional**

I added a lovely fringe to the bottom of my wall hanging. The fringe can be as long or as shorter as you like. When cutting the yarn, it should be 2 times the final length you are wanting. When you have cut your tassel fringe, insert your hook from the reverse side. Pull through two yarn strands, which have been folded in half to make a loop. Pull the yarn strands through the loop to form the tassel. Continue working along the bottom row and working 1 tassel (2 strands) into every other stitch. You should have 20 tassels.

### **Flowers - Optional**

I made 3 flowers using Yarn E and added them to the grass on my wall hanging.

MR – All the stitches go into the ring, Ch1, \*1dc, 1ss\*\* repeat until 5 more times, pull ring tight, break yarn, sew flowers onto the grass of your wall hanging.

### **Attaching to dowel**

Now you need to attach your wall hanging to your dowel. I like to crochet mine onto the dowel as I feel it is nice and secure. Here is a YouTube video on attaching your yarn to your dowel

You could also just sew your piece on to the dowel using a needle and long thread of yarn going through every stitch along the top and round your dowel.


To finish sew all ends in.
