

CROCHET PATTERN

Stripy Texture T-Shirt Yarn Rug

DIFFICULTY



UK TERMS



A beautiful and textured rug which is just the perfect project to sit down with and make this beautiful and easy crochet rug that works up super quick and is also perfect for beginners too!



MATERIALS

YARN

Yarn – Paintbox Yarns Recycled T-Shirt – Light Blue Shades x 8 balls
 4x Light Blue Shade (008)
 4x Medium Blue Shade (008)

HOOK

12mm

OTHER ITEMS

Yarn needle
 Scissors

FINISHED SIZE

Rug measures approximately
 183cmx112cm (72x44in) tassels included.

STITCH ABBREVIATIONS

UK Terms

CH(S) – Chain/Chain Stitch(es)
 SS – Slip Stitch
 DC – Double Crochet
 HTR – Half Treble Crochet
 TR – Treble Stitch
 INC – Number of Stitches in the same stitch
 STS – Number of stitches at the end
 RS – Right Side of the blanket facing you as you work
 WS – Wrong Side of the blanket facing you as you work

NOTES OR SPECIAL STITCHES

- Ch1 at the beginning of each row DOES NOT count as a stitch.
- Each stitch at the beginning of the row goes in the same stitch as the ch1.
- Turn at the end of each row.
- When a new colour is joined break yarn and join new colour.
- The pattern has a repeated colour sequence which is detailed in the pattern
- Starting ch counts as a tr stitch (the ch3 left at the beginning).
- BO – Bobble Stitch - 4htr into same st, remove loop from hook and insert hook into first of 4htr, slip loop back onto hook and pull through that first hdc.
- VST - V-Stitch – V-Stitch is made of 2tr in the same stitch.
- GR – Granny Stitch – Granny stitch is made of 3tr stitches in the same stitch.



PATTERN

To Start – 12mm hook, in **Medium Blue** chain 83.

Row 1 (RS) – 1tr in 4th chain from the hook, 1tr in each stitch to the end, turn [81 sts].

Row 2 (WS) - Ch1, 1tr in each stitch to the end, turn, cut yarn [81 sts].

Colour Sequence 1 - Colour Sequence Chart on next page

Row 3 (RS) - Ch1, 3htr, *bo, 4htr* repeat until the last 3 stitches, bo, 2htr, turn, cut yarn [81 sts 16 Bobbles].

Row 4 (WS) - Ch1, 1dc in each stitch to the end, turn, cut yarn [81 sts].

Row 5 (RS) - Ch1, 1tr, skip 1, *3tr inc, skip 2* repeat until the last 3 stitches, skip 2, 2tr inc in the last stitch, turn [81 sts].

Row 6 (WS) - Ch1, 1tr, 2tr inc in the space between the first 2 granny stitches, *3tr inc in each space across* repeat until the last space, 2tr inc in the last space 1tr in last stitch, turn, cut yarn [81 sts].

Row 7 (RS) - Ch1, 1tr, *skip 1, 2tr inc* repeat until the last 2 stitches, skip 1, 2tr inc in the last stitch, turn [81 sts].

Row 8 (WS) - Ch1, 1tr, *2tr inc* in between each 2tr inc from the previous row until the end, 2tr in last stitch, turn, cut yarn [81 sts].

Row 9 (RS) - Ch1, 1tr in each stitch to the end, turn [81 sts].

Row 10 (WS) - Ch1, 1tr in each stitch to the end, turn, cut yarn [81 sts].

Colour Sequence Chart on next page

Rows 11 – 18 – Repeat rows 3 – 10, using colour sequence 2.

Rows 19 – 26 – Repeat rows 3 – 10, using colour sequence 1.

Rows 27 – 34 – Repeat rows 3 – 10, using colour sequence 2.

Rows 35 – 42 – Repeat rows 3 – 10, using colour sequence 1.

Rows 43 – 50 – Repeat rows 3 – 10, using colour sequence 2.

Rows 51 – 58 – Repeat rows 3 – 10, using colour sequence 1.

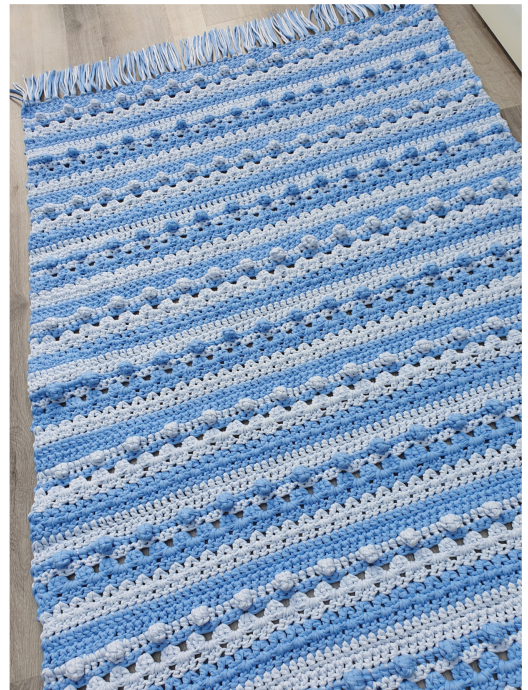
Rows 59 – 66 – Repeat rows 3 – 10, using colour sequence 2.

Rows 67 – 74 – Repeat rows 3 – 10, using colour sequence 1.

Rows 75 – 81 – Repeat rows 3 – 9, using colour sequence 2.

Row 82 (WS) - Ch1, 1dc in each stitch to the end, turn [81 sts].

To finish: Cut yarn & weave in ends.

Colour Sequence 1	Colour Sequence 2
Row 3 – Light Blue	Row 3 – Medium Blue
Row 4 – Medium Blue	Row 4 – Light Blue
Row 5 – Light Blue	Row 5 – Medium Blue
Row 6 – Light Blue	Row 6 – Medium Blue
Row 7 – Medium Blue	Row 7 – Light Blue
Row 8 – Medium Blue	Row 8 – Light Blue
Row 9 – Light Blue	Row 9 – Medium Blue
Row 10 – Light Blue	Row 10 – Medium Blue



Tassel Edges

Your blanket will have neat edges down the sides so we will be adding tassels to the ends of the blanket to finish it off.

For each tassel I cut a length of yarn from each of the x2 colours used, approximately 14 inches long and attached them from the first corner, *2 tassels, skip 1* to the last 4 stitches, 3 tassels in the last 3 stitches [55 tassels on end edge].

You can now trim your tassels if you want too for a nice neat finish.

That should be your rug all finished!
